**AN ORDINANCE
TO RESCIND
ORDINANCE #1862-91
AND CHAPTER 103
OF THE CODE
OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MAPLEWOOD**

"Interpretive Statement"

This ordinance will eliminate the municipal regulation of "Chlorofluorocarbons and Halons"

WHEREAS, the Township of Maplewood ("Township") passed Ordinance #1862-91 on July 2, 1991, seeking to regulate Chlorofluorocarbons and Halons; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance #1862-91 was codified in Chapter 103 of the Code of the Township of Maplewood; and

WHEREAS, the control of Chlorofluorocarbons and Halons has been preempted by and is now regulated by the United States Government; and

WHEREAS, it has therefore been recommended that Chapter 103 of the Code of the Township of Maplewood be rescinded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Maplewood, County of Essex, State of New Jersey that Ordinance #1862-91 be and is hereby repealed and Chapter 103 of the Code of the Township of Maplewood be and is hereby rescinded.

FIRST: Severability

If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the specific section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECOND: Repeal of Prior Ordinances

Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistencies.

THIRD: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication and as provided by law.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the foregoing proposed Ordinance was introduced and read by title for the first time at a meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Maplewood, held on November 5, 2014, and that Committee met again on November 17, 2014, at 7:30 p.m. at the Municipal Building, 574 Valley Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, at which time and place the Committee proceeded to consider the said Ordinance on second reading and final passage.
